TO: HOLDERS OF ALL GACA SUPPLEMENTAL TYPE
CERTIFICATES (STC) AND REPAIR DESIGN APPROVALS (RDA)

SUBJECT: Continuing Airworthiness Responsibilities for Holders of GACA
Supplemental Type Certificates and GACA Repair Design Approvals

In accordance with the Civil Aviation Act of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) as approved by the Council of Ministers Resolution No. 185 dated 17/07/1426H and issued by the Royal Decree No. M/44 dated 18/07/1426H. (23/08/2005G), and based on the authority granted in Article 179 of the Act, the following Regulations are issued under the authority of the President of General Authority of Civil Aviation, as a duly delegated representative of the GACA Board of Directors, in accordance with Order No.T-41, dated 30/12/1429H (28/12/2008G).

The GACA requires that:

With effect from 01/01/2012:

1. Each holder of a GACA Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) or GACA Repair Design Approval (RDA) shall have a system for collecting, investigating and analyzing reports received from aircraft owners, operators and approved maintenance organizations of information related to failures, malfunctions, defects or other occurrences which cause or might cause adverse effects on the continuing airworthiness of the product, part or appliance covered by the STC or RDA.
2. Each holder of a GACA Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) or GACA Repair Design Approval (RDA) shall report to GACA the results of its investigation and any action it is taking or proposes to take to correct a deficiency in its design.

Note:

Holders of GACA Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) or GACA Repair Design Approval (RDA) are reminded that in accordance with GACA/FAR 21.3 they are required to report to GACA any failures, malfunctions, defects or other occurrences which cause or might cause adverse effects on the continuing airworthiness of the product, part or appliance covered by the STC or RDA.
