

## GACA Circular No. R-10-2010

TO: GACA CERTIFICATE HOLDERS AND OPERATORS OF SAUDI

ARABIAN REGISTERED AIRCRAFT

SUBJECT: Service Difficulty Reporting to the Organization Responsible for the

Type Design

In accordance with the Civil Aviation Act of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia (KSA) as approved by the Council of Ministers Resolution No. 185 dated 17/07/1426H and issued by the Royal Decree No. M/44 dated 18/07/1426H. (23/08/2005G), and based on the authority granted in Article 179 of the Act, the following Regulations are issued under the authority of the President of General Authority of Civil Aviation, as a duly delegated representative of the GACA Board of Directors, in accordance with Order No.T-41, dated 30/12/1429H (28/12/2008G).

Notwithstanding GACA/FAR §§121.703, 125.409, 135.415 and 145.221 which requires Air Operators, Air Carriers and Repair Stations to submit service difficulty report to GACA;

With effect from 01/01/2011;

- 1) Each Certificate Holder and Operator of Saudi Arabian Registered Aircraft shall also transmit service difficulty information on faults, malfunctions, defects and other occurrences that cause or might cause adverse effects on the continuing airworthiness of the aircraft to the organization responsible for the type design of that aircraft (i.e. aircraft manufacturer).
- 2) Each Certificate Holder and Operator of Saudi Arabian Registered Aircraft shall establish appropriate procedures for submitting service difficulty information stated in item 1) above.
