


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VISION:

The Emergence of GACA



The beginning of civil aviation in the Kingdom goes back to the year 1364 AH, when the kingdom gained its first civil aircraft in the reign of King Abdulaziz. The first civil aviation system in Saudi Arabia was established in 1372 AH. The Department of Civil Aviation separated from the Saudi Royal Air Force which was comprised of the Saudi Arabian Airlines and Meteorology. The Saudi Arabian Airlines was separated from the Civil Aviation in 1379 AH and in 1386 meteorological has followed to become independent and have its own budget. In 1397 AH, The Department of Civil Aviation name was modified to become the Presidency of Civil Aviation, and in 1425AH the Council of Ministers issued a ruling to transform the Presidency of Civil Aviation to a public entity with a legal personality, and financial independence in accordance with the principles and commercial criteria, since then, the presidency has earned its new name, the «General Authority for Civil Aviation,» which aims for the liberalization and development of aviation in the Kingdom. The transformation will give it the necessary flexibility and achieve quantum leaps in all areas of civil aviation industry from the transportation of passengers and air cargo, to the building and development of airports and air navigation systems in the Kingdom.

Parameters of air traffic at the Kingdoms Airports in 2008:

The most significant features of air traffic at the airports of the Kingdom in 2008 are as follows:

- The number of passengers at Saudi Airbia airports reached more than 42 million passengers, an increase of 2% than 2007.
- The total air operations in the airports of the Kingdom has increased by 3% compared to 2007 to reach 407,987 operations. The interatnational Airports has an average increase of 7% in the number of air operations which was due to:
 - ✓ The transformation of Prince Mohammed bin Abdulaziz to an international Airport.
 - ✓ The Introduction of new foreign carriers to the Kingdom>s airports.
 - ✓ The increase of Pilgrims and visitors to the Holy Mosques.

On the other hand, the number of air operations has declined by 14% for the Domestic Airports, which was due to:

- ✓ Sama and NAS taking over the operations of some of the domestic airports and reducing the flights of Saudia there.
- The volume of cargo and Mail has reached 552,811 tons, Increased by 6% than 2007.














Cargo at International Airports (in 1000 tons)


Cargo at International Airports (in 1000 tons)














International Passengers (in million)


World Airport Ranking by International Passengers Traffic - 2008



Domestic Airports Shares of Passengers Traffic




International Airports Share of Passengers Traffic
